FROM THE DIRECTOR



According to Andrew Wilson in the March cover story of *Smithsonian* magazine, "... the name *Titanic* is the third most widely recognized word in the world after 'God' and 'Coca-Cola'." The name of a ship that set sail in April of 1912 and met

its end on its maiden voyage has become synonymous with words such as "disaster," "hubris," and "tragedy." In fact it is this connection with tragedy that first drew me to TITANIC THE MUSICAL. As a theatre instructor I teach the concept of classic tragedy as put forth by the ancient Greeks and followed by playwrights from Sophocles to Shakespeare: the story of the downfall of a great or potentially great character either from some tragic personal flaw or by circumstances beyond his/her control. In addition, most tragedies which have been written for the stage are based upon events or myths that are already well known by audiences. We know the outcome before we ever set foot in the theatre. No one goes to a performance of *Romeo and* Juliet wondering how the story will turn out—waiting to see if the young couple will live. We know the fate of the "star-crossed lovers" going in, yet we still buy our ticket, we still want to see the story. Knowing how it all turns out makes it somehow a different experience—something that is shared among those watching. We undergo a communal catharsis of sorts—a powerful release of emotion which is all the more powerful because we know in advance that it will happen. We attend tragedy to appreciate the unique retelling of the tragic tale—much like when we were a child and asked to hear our favorite book read to us again and again. So it is with the legend of Titanic. We know 'how it ends'—yet the story continues to call to us, to fascinate us. Oedipus Rex, Hamlet, Romeo and Juliet, the Legend of King Arthur are all great tragedies of the distant and not so distant past which have graced stages and movie screens time and time again. But there are very few great modern tragedies of our own time—stories which have become so much a part of our collective consciousness that everyone knows them. Titanic is one of those few—arguably the greatest one. Whatever your reason for attending this performance, you came knowing the ship sinks, knowing the inevitable conclusion. We all know. Yet we still want to hear the story—somehow we need to hear it.

And what a story. The tale of Titanic truly holds the "mirror up to nature" as Shakespeare said—revealing man at his very worst and his very best. Pride, greed, prejudice, and selfishness are set alongside hope, love, courage, and sacrifice. We see the harsh barriers of class separation and suspicion so prevalent in that time as in ours standing alongside the hopes and dreams for a new life and a chance to "rise above our class" as expressed by the immigrants who made up the bulk of Titanic's passengers.

In many ways, Maury Yeston's Tony Award winning rendition of the Titanic legend is as unique as the ship it emulates. It preceded the blockbuster movie by four months and won five Tony Awards including best musical and the first Tony ever given for Best Orchestrations. Unlike the popular Hollywood film which focuses on two fictional characters and their relationship, TITANIC THE MUSICAL reveals the real human beings who were on board: individuals of all classes and character as well as members of the crew. We see inside their many hearts and minds and realize that despite the differences which society decrees, in the end-- we are much more alike than we can ever be different. In most musicals, there are a handful of leads whose stories we follow with the majority of others relegated to minor roles in the chorus. In TITANIC THE MUSICAL, it is the ship itself who is the character—made up of a multitude of men, women, and children who present a model in miniature of all of humanity.

When my family and I attended the Titanic Artifact Exhibit several years ago in Milwaukee, I remember being affected greatly by what I saw: personal items brought up from two miles below the ocean's surface looked as if they had just been used vesterday—a cup, a comb, the button from a sleeve-- and the realization hit me that these were real people who faced the most horrible of circumstances imaginable. Their plight, their story took on a new meaning for me. The seeds were sewn then, I believe, for what would later lead to this production. It seems fitting this year on the 100th anniversary of Titanic's fateful launching that we come together, as have so many around the world, to honor the timeless voyage and those who inspired it—both victims and survivors. The students who comprise the cast and crew of TITANIC have expressed throughout the rehearsal process a deep feeling of solemn responsibility to tell that story well—to treat each character and every situation with the highest respect and truth. It has been a profoundly moving experience for everyone involved. We hope you will also find it so. It is their greatest wish and mine that through their efforts, the story of Titanic will continue and that the memory of all who were on board and the lessons they have to still to teach us will endure forever.

As Titanic's survivors and the spirits of those who perished sing together in the final song:

Sail on, sail on
Great ship, Titanic!
'Cross the open sea
Pray the journey's sound
Till your port be found
Fortune's winds
Sing Godspeed to thee....

Thank you for your attendance this evening and enjoy the show.

ON THE USE OF DRAMATIC LICENSE

One of the givens of directing high school theatre is that for every one male student who auditions, there are typically ten females. At North over the years we have been very lucky to have a strong group of young men contribute their talents to our stage, but still the number of young women typically far exceeds them. In order to provide more opportunity for our female students we have at times altered a character's gender or had women playing men's roles. Such is the cast in TITANIC. Because all of the characters in the musical are based upon real historical personages, some of the changes are more obvious than in other productions. The telegraph operator Harold Bride has been altered to Harriet Bride. This was a difficult deci-

sion at first until my research revealed that many, many women were actually employed as telegraph operators at the turn of the century. It was one of the few professions outside the home that was available to them. In the book The Employments of Women: A Cyclopaedia of Woman's Work by Virginia Penny, she states, "A new source of employment has been opened by the invention of the electric telegraph. Most of the telegraphing in England is done by women, and in the United States a number of ladies are employed as operators. To a quick and intelligent mind it requires but a short time to learn. An English paper says: "Here women do the business better than men, because of the more undivided attention they pay to their duties. We have been told that, in one telegraph office in London, several

hundred women are employed." Due to this fact, I felt safe within the realm of historical accuracy to make the gender change. Another major figure on board the Titanic, Henry Etches, first class steward has been changed to Henrietta Etches. Once again, the change is consistent with the role of women as stewardesses aboard ocean liners of the day. Several men's roles such as Officer Herbert Pittman and Band Leader Wallace Harley are played as men by female cast members.

A NOTE ON NORTH'S PRODUCTION

As you probably have noticed several of the characters listed in the program have the names of two students playing them. This is a result of our decision to double-

cast shows at North. Double-casting means that two students play the same role on alternating nights. North is the only high school in Appleton to double-cast its shows. Our decision to do so is completely student-centered. Double-casting allows many more students to be involved in a production and gives more opportunities for lead roles. In addition, students who share a character part develop a cooperative learning relationship with each other, drawing from each other's strengths and helping bolster each other's weaknesses. The result is more learning and more fun—which is the true purpose of educational theatre. But double-casting does mean more work for everyone involved from actor to director to designer. It is also more expensive—more costumes need to be made, more music

rented, more rehearsal time involved. But the benefits for students in both artistic and personal growth are hard to argue with.

In addition, North's theatre provides special challenges for a production as large and elaborate as TITANIC. Our lack of a music pit, requires us to be creative in where to place the orchestra. This year we have constructed special loft along the back wall of the stage! Placing them behind the performers however requires the rigging up of a closed-circuit camera system to allow the conductor to see the students on stage and for them to follow him. Our lack of a "fly-house" to raise and lower more inexpensive painted drops requires us to build more expensive and cumbersome

rolling units restricting even further the limited space we have backstage to coordinate over the over one-hundred students involved in the production. Despite these and other difficulties or perhaps partly because of them, the students who make up TITANIC THE MUSICAL have risen to the task. They have worked long and hard to prepare a show of which they all can be proud. North's TITANIC has many special theatrical elements never before seen in other productions of this musical. Doing something new is always a risk, but one they were enthusiastically willing to take. Even though they had to do it "the hard way," they did it and refused to ever compromise on excellence. In an era where young people are said to be less hard-working and less caring, that is something of which we can all be proud.

Wians-Bixby, Kim (Trumpet) is very happy to be a part of the pit for *Titanic* and hopes that you enjoy the show!






